Team Selection Process

Rosters



Parent Expectations

Conduct

As a Fellowship of Christian Athletes affiliated organization, we are called to be different. This shows in the way we conduct ourselves on and off the field. We want to have fun and play to the best of our ability with a very strong competitive attitude, however, adversity and situations will arise that we cannot control. We understand there will be bad calls, tough games, and rowdy opposing parents. That being said, we will not allow vulgar or rude behavior at any practice or game from players or parents. There will also be no parental coaching from the stands during games. Also, please refrain from handing players food or drinks during games as this is frowned upon at the high school and college levels.

It is expected that players are adequately prepared before the game. Please know that our coaches will help your kids make the necessary adjustments. Just sit back and enjoy watching your kid play the sport they love with their friends, surrounded by people that love them. At the end of the day, our teams represent Christ and we must do that to the best of our ability.

* Help contribute to the Empowered Culture. Have constructive conversations especially pre-game and post-game car rides, serve and love those around you, exude joy amongst each other and to our opponents.

Communication

Communication is key to ensure that any conflicts, questions, or concerns are relayed to a coach or staff member. Great communication is one of our goals and we will make sure that we do that to the best of our ability. Our communication runs through TeamSnap where coaches will communicate all practices, games, and events. Parents are asked to mark availability at least 24 hours before practices, games and events. Practice plans are made around not only player needs but availability. In order to build good habits in communication, we ask our players to be the primary communicators of their availability. For example, If your player is missing a practice or has a uniform question please have the player communicate with a coach. This is a great way to prepare him for high school and especially college. We understand there are some situations that require parental involvement so if that's the case please feel free to reach out. We feel it is best to hold our players accountable and to help them grow in the area of communicating with coaches and staff members.

Commitment

So Cal Catch Baseball is an organization that strives for excellence and doing things at the highest level. We expect the same from our players and parents in the every season. We understand that the fall is not a primary baseball season and we encourage multi-sport activity however, it is our expectation that you will be at 90-100% of all team games, practices, and events unless communicated otherwise with us upfront. Please communicate any conflicts or misses via TeamSnap during all seasons. We understand that situations arise and it's expected that if you will not be there it will be communicated to your coach a few days before the scheduled event.

Players are not allowed to play for other travel baseball teams during season. If there is an issue with lack of game play please contact the Director of Youth Teams Sebastian Dunn.

Volunteer Opportunities

GameChanger

Each team will need 1 or more parents to help with game scoring. GameChanger is a program we use to help keep our stats and box scores for our games and it can be done from your phone. This program is also helpful for family and fans who cannot attend games. The GameChanger volunteer will be responsible for inputing balls, strikes, outs, plays, hits, runs, etc into the game changer application. If interested, volunteers may reach out to Sebastian Dunn and he will grant you login access.

Program Coordinator

Each team will have a program coordinator. This role will require planning and setup of all team events off the field. Our goal is 1 team event every other month. The team program coordinator will collaborate with the coaches and Director of Youth Teams to schedule and plan these events, help with fundraising and help with sponsorship opportunities for missions trips, baseball trips and other FCA related activities. 
